

Hello to all the lovely learners in Forth Class and all their families. We are all missing you and hoping that you are all keeping well at home. Here are a few ideas for you to try at home.

The following are suggestions for all learners so will need to be adapted or ignored as appropriate.

- Keep a diary (written, typed or using pictures)
- Write a story or make up a story and ask an adult to scribe it for you
- Read words in newspapers, magazines, on packaging
- Listen to stories read to you or on Youtube
- Retell a familiar story in your own words/act it out
- Practise writing your name, address, postcode, date of birth
- Play Kim's Game (a collection of objects, look then cover and see how many you can remember. You can also remove one and see if they can say what is missing)
- Follow instructions e.g. walk forward 2 steps, turn right, walk forward 3 steps etc
- Play yes/no games
- Give me (an object) or give an object to Dad
- Use your voice to ask for objects, give instructions,
- Ask and answer questions

If you have a computer or a tablet:

- Type your name address, postcode, date of birth
 - Type a story
 - Change font, font size, font colour
 - Choose a topic and find information on the internet
 - Copy and paste information and pictures
 - Send an email
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- Match coins
 - Use a calculator (there are some online) to work out totals and change
 - Add on 1, take away 1, double numbers
 - Practise writing numbers
 - Practise days of the week and months of the year
 - Recognise dice patterns
 - Play board games
 - Match and pair up socks
 - Water play - full empty, half full, how many cups needed to fill the jug

Life Skills

- Dressing/undressing
- Setting the table, clearing up, washing dishes
- Helping with the laundry
- Making toast, a sandwich or simple snack
- Pouring a drink

We have been doing a lot of dancing and ball skills in PE recently. Here are some ideas you could try at home.

- Making a dance routine (Choose 4 dance moves for example clapping hands, stamping feet, shaking head, spin around. Do each move for 4 beats. Repeat). The number of dance moves can be increased or decreased as needed. You could also have a little practice at finding the beat of the music by clapping or stamping and counting 4 beats at a time.
- Throwing balls into a tub (You can use rolled up socks as balls and anything as a target). Pots and pans are great for this as they are noisy which makes it a bit more exciting! You can also give different sizes of targets and distances of targets points. Count and add up the points at the end of each game. (You could also do this game on a table top and roll the balls instead and put the pots on their side as targets.
