

Art Activity Easy to Intermediate

Fun things to make and do with paper No.4 (Making paper jewellery) Dazzle everyone with some bespoke jewellery!



Rip up some pieces of paper (approx. 8-12 cm square)




Dip the paper into some water.

(Easy) Pop your beads into a tub and make noise, shake it to the beat of a song you like!

Materials: scrap paper, could include wrapping paper, tissue paper and coloured paper. Glue stick (or egg white), scissors, thread/wool, beads (optional)

Easy/Intermediate



Shape your wet paper into a ball around your wool or string.



Continue adding the wet balls of paper, about 7 or 8 with spaces between them, or make more balls with less space between them.

Intermediate



Cut strips of paper approx. 10cmx3cm and fold in half.



Cut the folded strip to make a long thin triangle.



Wrap the large end of the triangle around a pencil or paint brush or straw.



Glue the tip to secure the bead.




Try making different sizes and coloured beads.



Wrap some tape around both ends of your thread/wool to make it easier to thread.



Push the thread/wool through all your beads and when finished tie a knot to secure them.



If you want spaces between your beads, push the thread back through the bead, this will stop the bead from moving about.



If you have plastic beads at home, you could add them too.

Art Activity Intermediate to Challenging

Fun things to make and do with paper No.4 (Making paper jewelry) Dazzle everyone with some bespoke jewellery!

Materials: scrap paper, could include wrapping paper, tissue paper and coloured paper. Glue stick (or egg white), scissors.



For **patterned paper** that is white on the other side, fold over and cut out and glue together. To fit around the average wrist cut a length of approx. 45cm x 4cm width.




You will need 2 strips of paper, find colours that go well together. If your paper is not long enough you can tape it together to get the correct length. You do not have to fold paper over that is the same colour on each side (approx. 45cm x 2cm).


Glue or tape the two ends together at right angles.




Fold patterned paper over blue paper.




Fold blue over patterned paper.



Blue over pattern.



Pattern over blue.



Keep folding one piece over the other. When there is no paper left to fold, trim excess, then glue or tape the ends together to make a bracelet.

Why not try different patterns and colours and combinations of paper.
