You could make a paper plate **snail** - colour in the plate and add in a face and 'horns'. Then, get an adult to cut the start of a spiral to make the snail's body and shell.

You could also make a paper plate **whale** - Colour in or paint the plate grey /blue. Then, get an adult to cut the off the bottom of the plate off to make a tail. Don't forget an eye too!  
You could use some blue paper or tissue for the water.




### Art Activity

### PE Activity

The PE task this week is another favourite at school; **The Treasure Game**. This game can be played individually or against others.

Firstly, multi player: Gather lots of items (roughly between 10 and 20) that can be easily picked up in one hand and place them in a pile in the middle of the room or garden. Set up each player in separate corners and give them a hoop or bucket to collect all their treasure in.

Players must go and collect **1 item at a time** and take it back to their corner. The game ends when there are no items left in the middle. The player with the most treasure items in their corner wins.

To play individually time how long it takes to collect all the treasure, then try to beat that time.
